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01. The Eighth Penthouse

The first week of May 2025 presented a major milestone in the lifespan of a unique project, with the release to market of the Studio Kennon-designed penthouse at The Eighth. A project almost seven years in the making, the completion of the penthouse marks the final piece of the puzzle in a long journey that has culminated in the delivery of a very special home in Melbourne.

The Eighth's building composition was defined in the embryonic stages of the project through discussions between Nicolas Crema and Pete Kennon (then at Elenberg Fraser).

Both aspired to create a building fit for modern times. A building that, over time, would become a 'container of life'.

The building's make-up would include buzzing hospitality (still working on this), progressive offices, a modern-age wellbeing facility, apartments for the most discerning owners, an enviable rooftop, and a penthouse crowning the structure that would sit shoulder to shoulder with some of the best apartments from around the world.

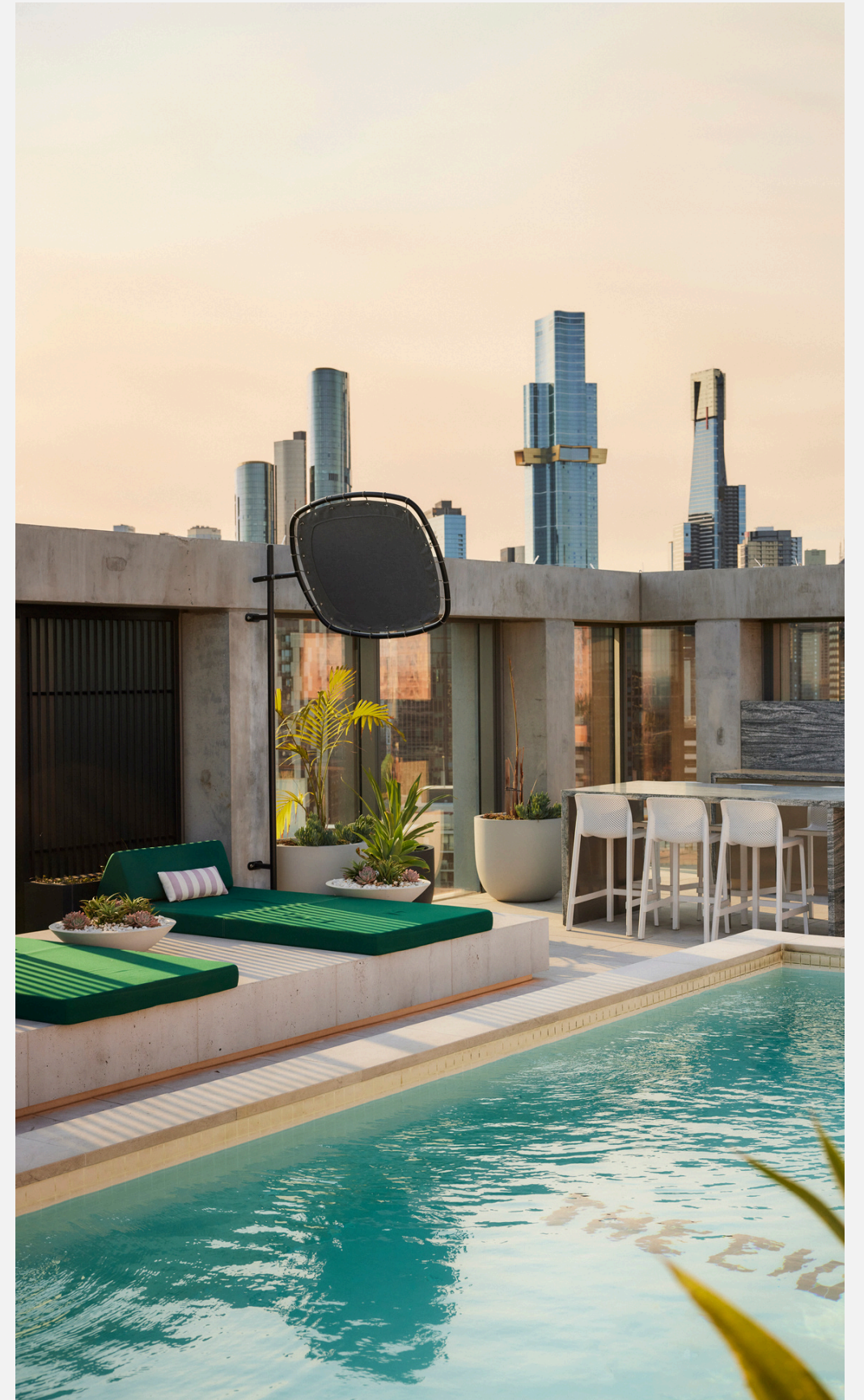
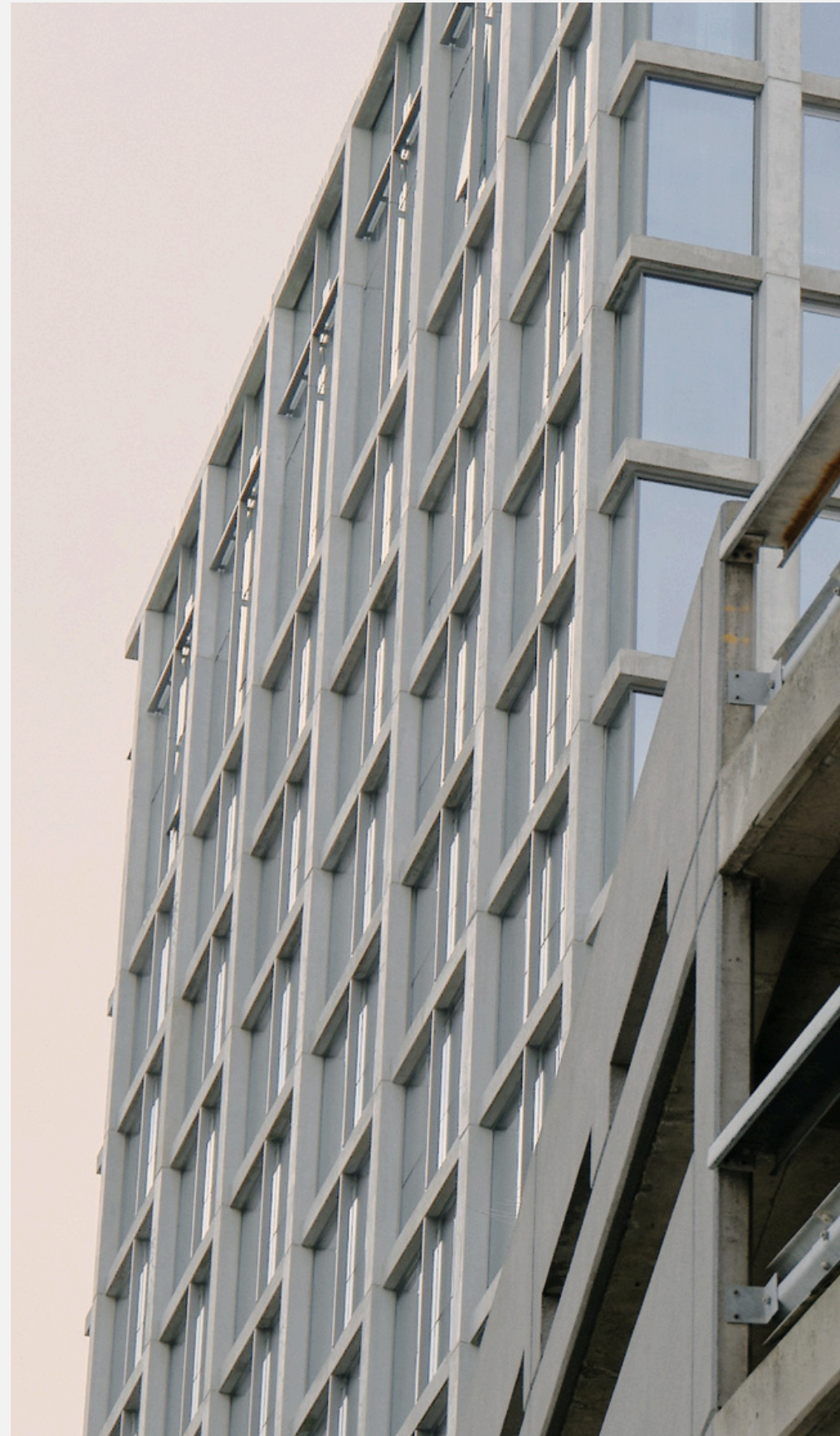
Fast forward many months, endless design iterations, and unprecedented times (Covid-19), and the finished product is finally here to view.

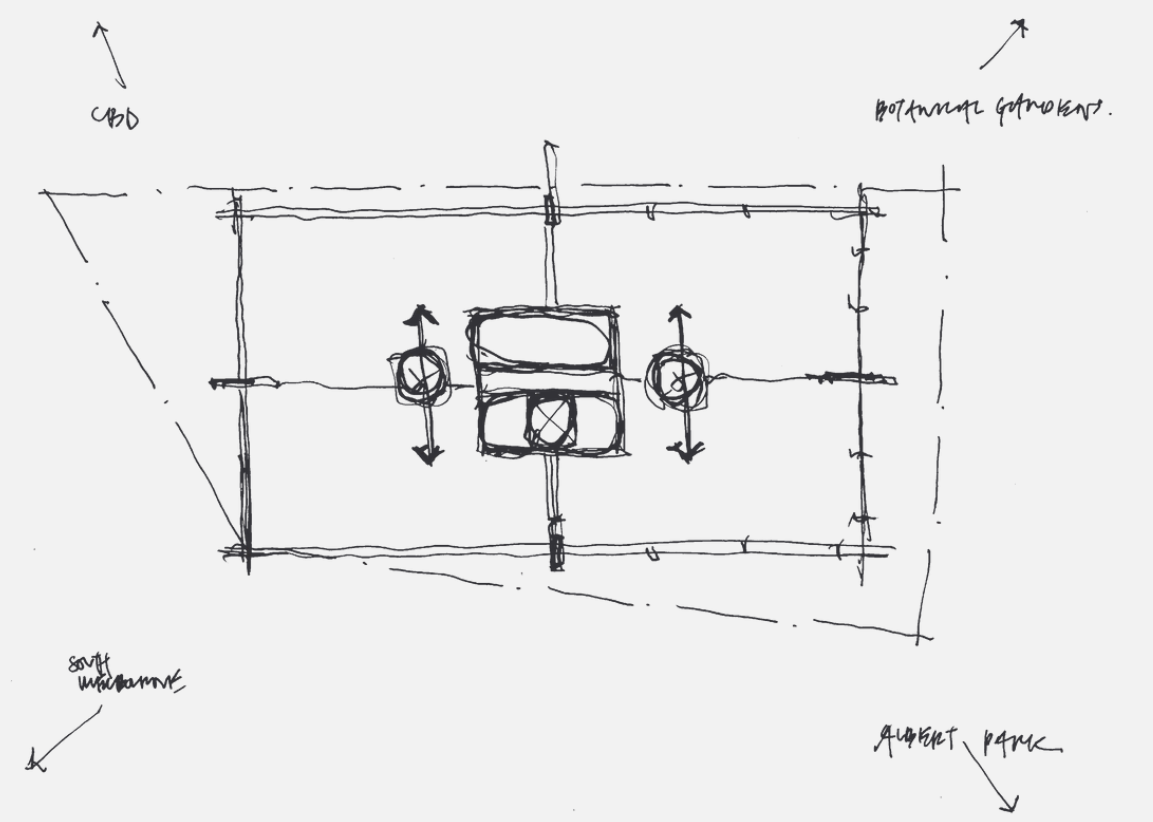
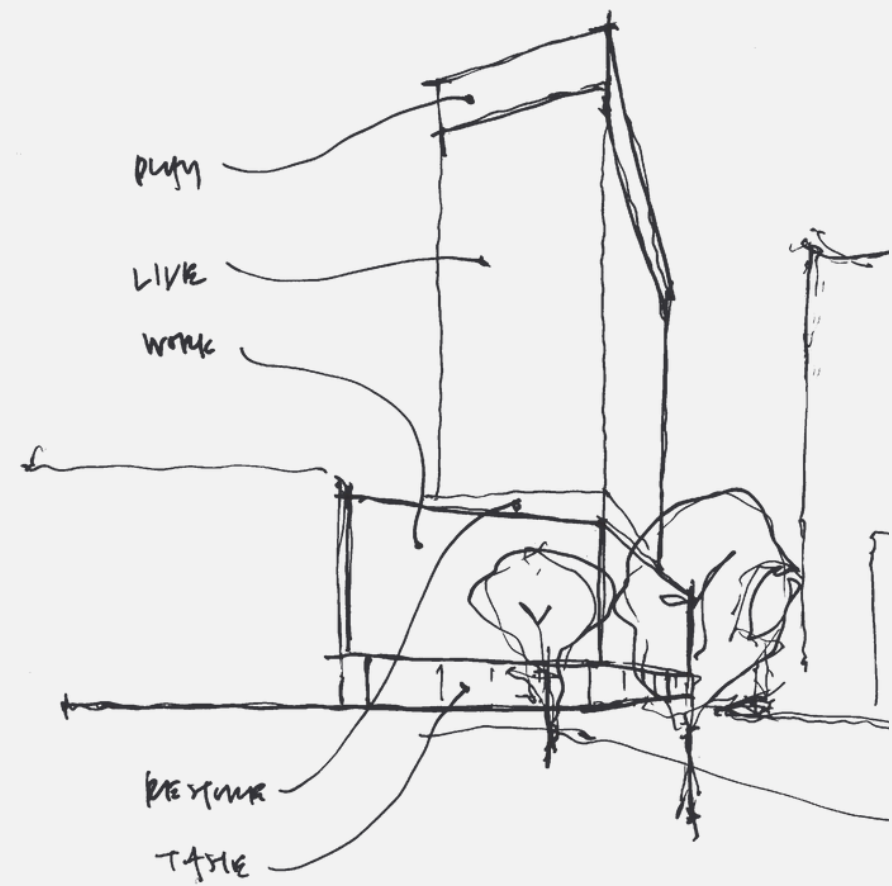
A true collaboration from start to finish, the The Eighth Penthouse is reflective of a long-term partnership committed to delivering something defining, unreplicable and inspiring.

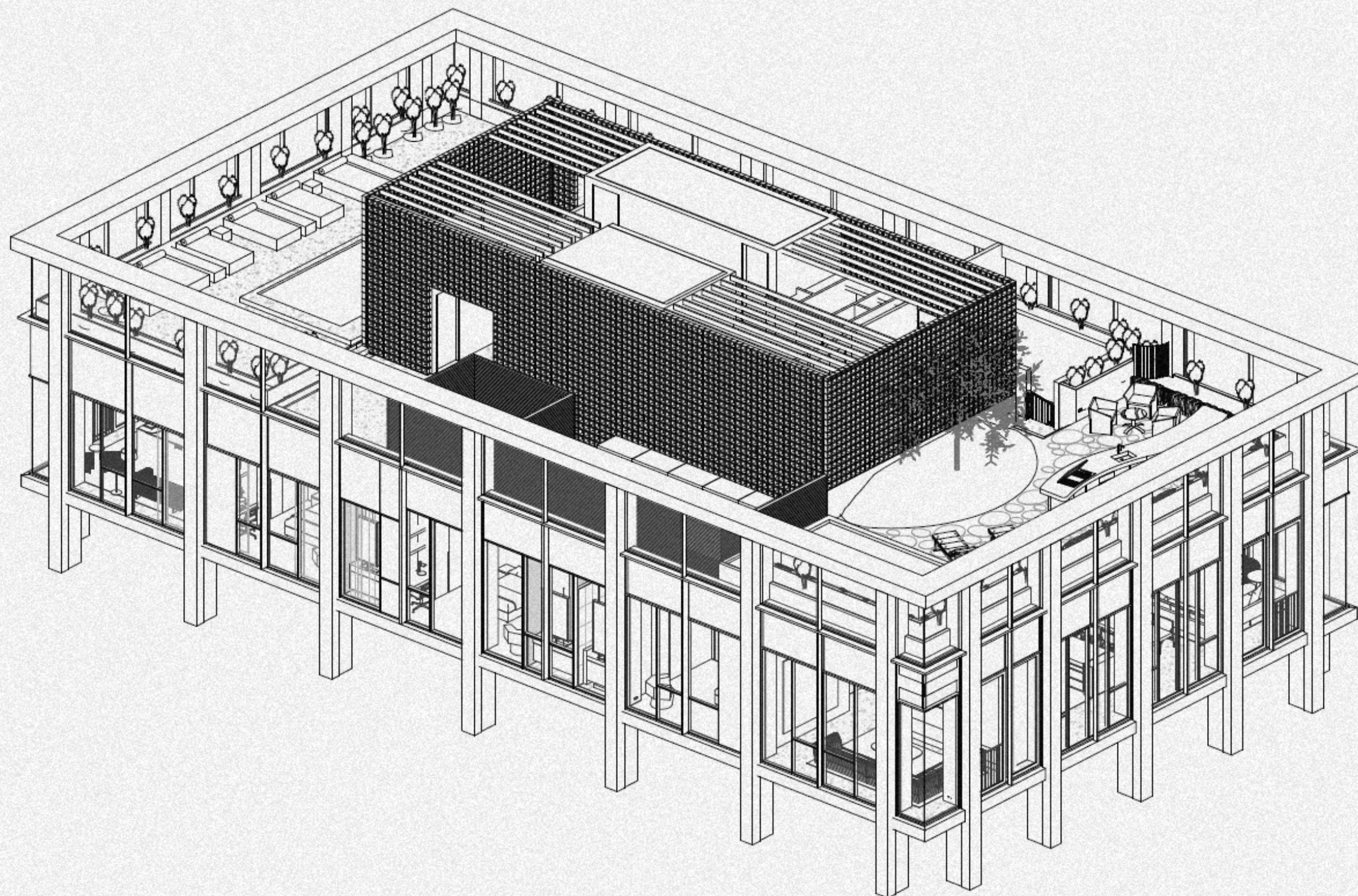
Early concept designs of The Eighth by Pete Kennon.

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02. A Furniture Discussion

Integrating old with new to create a one-off proposition.

It's somewhat fitting that The Eighth Penthouse launched to market in the week following the end of the 2025 Salone del Mobile in Milano.

The annual design event is a week-long celebration of design, architecture, and innovation, drawing international designers and industry professionals.

The Eighth Penthouse furniture strategy took a combined team effort from a number of contributors, curated by Studio Kennon and bumped in over the course of four weeks. Utilising a combination of rented, borrowed and purchased pieces sourced from around the world, the end result is a masterful showcase of timeless design and function, and a celebration of some of the world's most famous furniture designers.

From the mid-century Italian desk by Vittorio Dassi, c.1950, which sits in the formal study, to the Murano chandeliers by Fontana Arte for Zero Quattro, c.1970s, that hang above Jack Watson's custom 16 person timber dining table, old meets new to complement and enhance Kennon's graceful design palette.

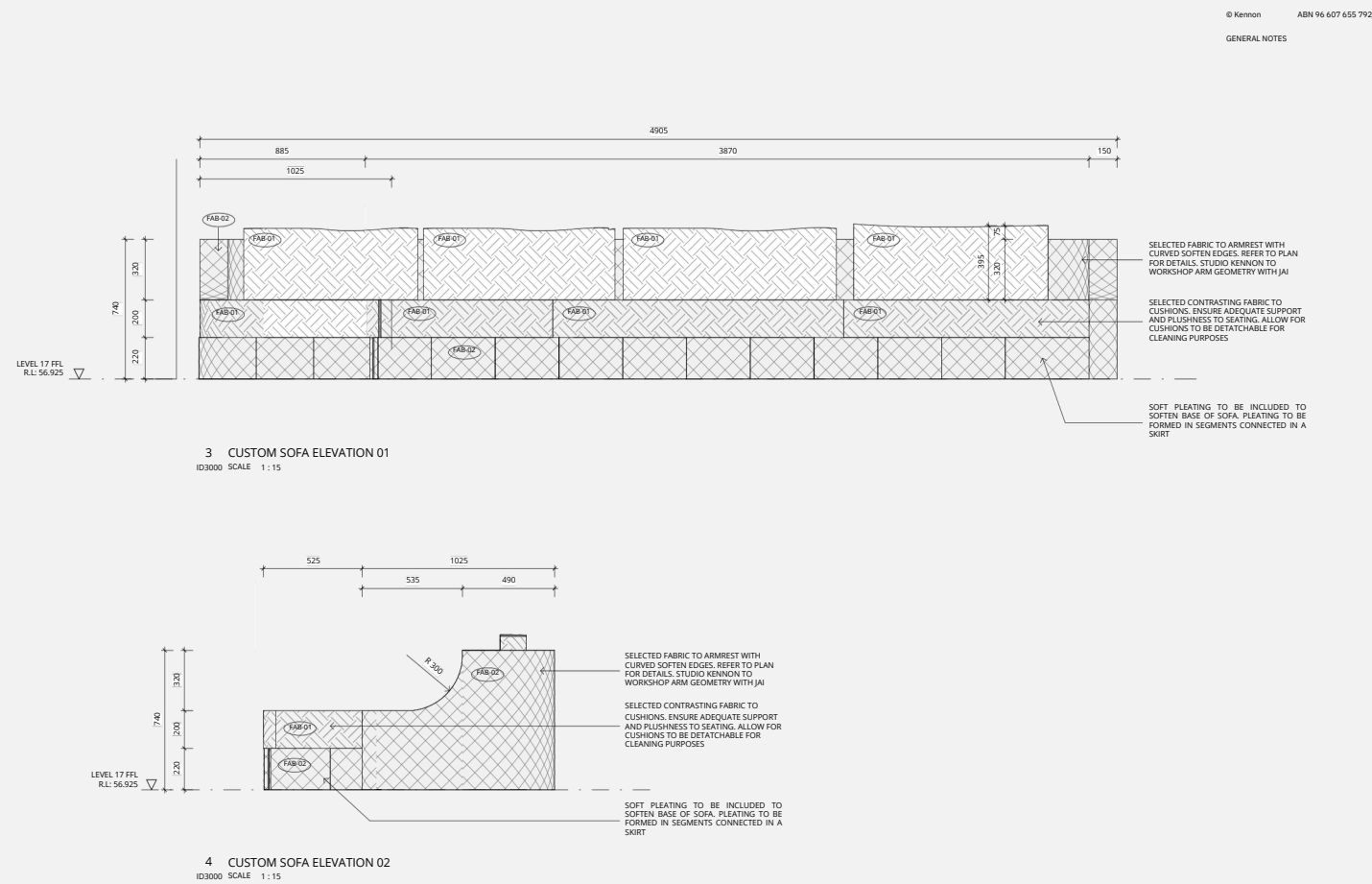
